2. John Strand- Black Hills Information Security (BHIS): John Strand is the owner of Black Hills Information Security (BHIS), and has both consulted and taught hundreds of organizations in the areas of cybersecurity, regulatory compliance, and penetration testing. John is also an instructor and course author of BlackHat's "Active Defense, Offensive Countermeasures, and Hacking Back" and the SANS Institute's "Hacker Tools, Techniques, Exploits and Incident Handling" classes.

3. Jim Severson, Harold Timmerman & Sheriff Dennis Johnson- Lincoln County, SD: Harold Timmerman has been the County Emergency Manager for Lincoln County since 2002. Harold is a volunteer firefighter for Lennox Volunteer Fire Department since 1970 and served as Chief for eight years. Harold has been a board member of The South Dakota Incident Management Assistance Team (IMAT) since its inception, serving as Incident Commander and Operations Section Chief. In addition, Harold is an Emergency Management Representative to the South Dakota Public Safety Communications Council that oversees and manages the South Dakota State Radio system.

Sheriff Dennis Johnson began his law enforcement career in 1977 when he joined the US Army as a military policeman. He entered South Dakota law enforcement in January 1981 and served in the Harrisburg and Canton Police Departments until he was elected Lincoln County Sheriff in 1998. He took office in January 1999 and has served in that capacity since. Sheriff Johnson is the current president of the South Dakota Sheriffs' Association and has served or is currently serving on numerous other law enforcement related boards as well as a number of other non-profit board of directors.

Jim Severson has worked in Law Enforcement and Corrections in South Dakota since 1981. Jim has been with the SD Division of Criminal Investigation (DCI) since 1995. Shortly after 9-11, Jim was assigned to the SD Joint Terrorism Task Force (JTTF) in Sioux Falls. Jim spent 3 years on the JTTF and worked various cases involving domestic and international terrorism. Jim also attended numerous trainings in regards to terrorism and taught several classes throughout the state to various agencies. Jim is currently assigned to the DCI office in Canton, SD and responded to both of the active shooter situations in Lincoln County in 2015.

4. Don Hughes: Donald Hughes began his Firefighter / Paramedic career in 1984 and is currently the Fire and Paramedic Chief for the City of Satellite Beach, Florida. During his career, Chief Hughes has served in various command roles in large scale natural and man-made disasters, including Florida Fire Storms, 2004 Florida Hurricane Season, and Deep Water Horizon. Chief Hughes is also a Unit Commander for the U.S Department of

Health and Human Services, Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT), a mobile medical asset provides medical care in disaster zones with a team of physicians, mid-level practitioners, nurses and paramedics. Chief Hughes deployed to various disasters including Hurricanes Katrina, Rita, and Sandy. Chief Hughes is a senior adjunct instructor for the United States National Fire Academy, lecturing nationwide on Fireground Incident Management, Disaster Incident Management, Fire Service Leadership, Firefighter Health and Safety and EMS Research.

1. Brad Patrick-Burlington Northern Railway: Mr. Patrick, started with Burlington Northern Railroad in 1991 as a Corporate Industrial Hygienist. He became the Assistant Director of Hazardous Materials Safety in 1992. Upon Burlington Northern's merger with Santa Fe in January 1996, Patrick became the Manager of Hazardous Materials Field Operation and Emergency Response and was promoted to the Asst. Director of Hazardous Materials in 2002, Director Hazardous Materials in 2014 and to General Director, Hazardous Materials Safety in 2015. Additionally, Patrick is a Certified Industrial Hygienist and a Certified Safety Professional.

2. Raquel Lackey & Kristin Cox: Raquel Lackey is a Certified Public Accountant and is currently serves on the boards of both HOPE Animal-Assisted Crisis Response and Reading with Rover, crisis and therapy animal nonprofit organizations. Raquel has been working with her dogs in both arenas of Animal-assisted Therapy and Animal-assisted Crisis Response since 2010.

Kristin L. Cox, MA, has coordinated resiliency support for the past 23 years for first responder agencies. She has served as the Board President of the Washington State Critical Incident Stress Management Network (CISM) & served on the Oregon State Network board as well. She is an experienced CISM technical specialist with NIMS Type 1 incident experience and has coordinated responses to numerous line of duty deaths, search and rescue cases, suicides, Hurricane Katrina, WA State Wildland Fires 2015 and aircraft disasters. She has worked closely with Seattle Fire and Police departments, the Department of Defense, Canadian Coast Guard, corrections departments, state, non-profit and mental health agencies.

3. Timothy Smith & Ann Hammer- DHS Domestic Nuclear Detection Office (DNDO): Ann Hammer is a Systems Analyst at Sandia National Laboratories supporting

multiple U.S. Department of Homeland Security programs for the past 5 years. Some of her recent work involves building radiological/nuclear detection capability with state and local partners across the U.S. Ms. Hammer's other experience has included developing national level guidance documents for indoor and outdoor BioWatch Program operations as well as supporting the acquisition of new biodetection technologies for this nationwide program; performing modeling and simulation analysis to inform the security strategy for the new World Trade Center Complex; deploying an integrated modeling and mapping tool to support FEMA exercises; and most recently studying use cases for a methodology developed to determine supply chain risks for cyber attacks.

Timothy Smith is with the Department of Homeland Security, DNDO and will be copresenting with Ann Hammer.

4. Andrew Dolan- Mutli-State Information Sharing & Analysis Center: The MS-ISAC is the focal point for cyber threat prevention, protection, response and recovery for the nation's state, local, tribal and territorial (SLTT) governments. The MS-ISAC 24x7 cybersecurity operations center provides real-time network monitoring, early cyber threat warnings and advisories, vulnerability identification, mitigation, and incident response.

5. Douglas J. DeLancey-DHS Office of Bombing Prevention: Doug DeLancey is a South Dakota native and former Army Colonel who graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point and has been deployed multiple times in Airborne, Mechanized and Air Assault Infantry units to Iraq, Africa, Panama, and Afghanistan in support of the Improvised Explosive Device fight. He has been awarded the Legion of Merit, three Bronze Stars and an Army Commendation Medal for Valor and is a graduate of Army Airborne and Ranger School. He retired from the Army in 2010 and currently serves as a civilian in the Department of Homeland Security's Office for Bombing Prevention.

6. Jonathan L. Watson- FBI, Minneapolis Division: Jonathan L. Watson has been an FBI intelligence analyst for 11 years. His work focuses on the African terrorist group al-Shabaab. Previously he served as Chief Reports Officer for FBI Minneapolis Division. Jon is a licensed attorney and holds a graduate degree in homeland security leadership from George Washington University. He is a frequent public speaker on terrorism and

intelligence matters.

7. Sarah Miller- National Disaster Preparedness Training Center: Sarah Miller is a Certified Emergency Manager (CEM) who is currently an independent emergency management trainer and consultant. She most recently served more than 9 years as the Emergency Manager for the City of Auburn, Washington. Her 25+ years of public service includes 12 years as a public safety dispatcher and 9 years as a search and rescue volunteer. She currently works with a number of FEMA training partners to deliver courses across the country on topics including social media, whole community, situational awareness, ICS, and CERT, as well as teaching in the National Basic and Advanced Emergency Management Academies.
