CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Bode called the regular meeting of the Davison County Board of Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. Members of the Board present were Claggett, Kiner, Reider, Bode. Absent Weitala. Also present was Auditor Kiepke.

PLEDGE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairperson Bode.

REMEMBRANCE

Chairperson Bode asked for a moment of remembrance for past commissioner Bernie Schmucker who passed away last week. She said she was so thankful to have been a part of the presentation of the coin ceremony that took place a couple of weeks ago to honor World War II Veterans of which Bernie was one.

DISCUSSION

Jay Larson stated he has been an instructor for the Hunt Safe classes for 38 years in Mitchell. He saw on the agenda the commissioners would be discussing the use of the Fairground facility for these classes. He said there are ten instructors for the classes and they use a team teaching approach. There were 147 students that participated in 2017.

He reported that classes are now offered on-line. However, it is firmly believed that hands on experience is needed for each individual. For this reason, the Saturday portion of the three-day instruction is open to those that have taken class on line. Saturday is the day students go to the trap range for hands on experience.

Larson stated that 4-H shooting sports is different than the Hunt Safe classes. Hunt Safe classes focus on ethics and such. 4-H shooting sports focuses on shooting.

There is a mentoring program for children ages 10-12. The mentor must have a hunting license. In addition, to acquire a hunting license prior to the age of 16, you must possess a hunt safe card.

QUARTERLY COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSE REPORT

Community Health Nurse Becky Erdahl presented the fourth quarterly report for 2017. Clerical staff Marcy VanZee was introduced to the group.

There have been a total of 634 flu vaccinations given. 344 were given to children ages 6 mo - 18 years at the Mitchell Area Flu Pod, as well as at clinics at DWU, Mitchell Senior High, Ethan & Mt. Vernon schools and Abbott House. There were also four flu clinics held for State employees.

27 pregnancy risk assessments were completed and 61 baby care contacts were made during the 4th quarter.

A total of 239 clients were seen for family planning services in the 4th quarter with 27 of the clients being new. 53 clients were tested for chlamydia and gonorrhea, while 29 clients were tested for syphilis and HIV.

In the Cribs for Kids program, 4 Cribs for Kids sleep kits including Pack 'n plays, liners, sleep sacks, pacifiers and brochures on safe sleep were distributed to families that needed a safe place to sleep for their infants.

WIC had 522 participants in December. 154 WIC certifications were completed and 232 clients received nutrition counseling in this quarter.

It was reported that influenza activity in January, 2018 is at a "Widespread" level in South Dakota.
