INLAND SEARCH AND RESCUE PLANNING COURSE

(Education & Training Course Announcements course number: E5AZGIC371-00AA)

The National Search & Rescue School was established in 1966 as a facility devoted exclusively to training professionals to conduct search and rescue (SAR). The school is currently located at USCG Training Center Yorktown, Virginia, and teaches a variety of maritime and inland search planning courses. Graduates number over 22,000 men and women, civilian and military, including over 1,800 from 103 foreign nations.

The 5-day Inland SAR Planning course is a comprehensive look at inland search theory and its application to land and air searches for missing persons and aircraft with a focus on wilderness, not urban, searches.

The course consists of classroom lessons and practical, tabletop exercises. This course does <u>not</u> incorporate field training. Emphasis is on the planning necessary for effective area-type searching during an extended search using Probability of Success (POS), rather than just a few elements of POC (POA) or POD, to predictively allocate limited resources to their best effect. In essence, what to do <u>after</u> the rapid (hasty) search and specialty resources have not found the missing person. Additional topics include pre-plan development, legal aspects, the federal role in SAR, and related subjects. The course does <u>not</u> teach search tactics or technical procedures, as those are well covered from other readily available sources.

The course is directed toward SAR leaders in federal, state, and local emergency services and law enforcement, as well as Civil Air Patrol, international, and volunteer SAR agencies — those few people who are responsible for the planning and overall conduct of inland search missions. The target audience includes on-scene incident commanders and their planners, operations leaders, and up-channel reporting chain. The general searcher or search team leader, while arguably the most important part of the SAR team, will not find this course useful.

Aiming to "find the objective fast," the course centers on tools to help SAR decision makers determine where to search, how to divide an area between limited search resources, and how to craft the overall search effort to gain the best increases in likelihood of success at each step. The tools are mathematically based and not for the faint of heart; they help quantify the uncertainties of the search problem to allow consistent application throughout a mission.

Classes begin promptly at 0800 on the convening date and graduate by 1500 on the fifth day.

Prior to class, students should review and be conversant on the following from their own agencies in order to make class discussions more useful and help integrate class materials with their own search environments back home:

- Search pre-plans
- Decision making guidelines for where/when/how to search
- Agreements and relationships with other SAR agencies
- How their agency organizes on scene
- o Recent search missions

A firm grounding in SAR terminology and employment techniques, practical SAR experience, basic arithmetic and calculator skills, an understanding of local SAR mission management requirements, and an open mind are essential.

- The Inland SAR Planning Course is an <u>advanced</u> course for experienced on-scene decision makers, planners, operations leaders, and direct support staff members. It presents <u>mathematically based search planning tools</u> with solid theoretical underpinnings, along with some allied topics, focused on improving overall SAR response and success.
- 3. Openings in each class are limited and must be shared between a variety of agencies and student backgrounds, experience, and organizational tiers. While the school accepts applications directly, the state or agency SAR Coordinator's administration of applications is preferred to ensure all state/local SAR organizations are represented and the appropriate student experience/training background is achieved.
 - a. Application deadlines are approximately 6 weeks before class start dates. A welcome package will be sent to confirm attendance no later than 30 days before class start dates; students must firmly commit to attend at that time. Interested agencies should contact the school early to reserve quotas.
 - All Civil Air Patrol (CAP) members <u>must</u> apply through their wing training office to CAP National HQ.
- The classes are offered tuition-free to US citizens involved directly in SAR. However, each student or their organization is responsible for all personal expenses, travel, lodging, meals, etc.

The Davison County Volunteer Search and Rescue Unit is an organized group of 15-20 trained volunteers, who assist local agencies in emergency and disaster situations. We work closely with the Mitchell Police Department, Mitchell Fire Department, Davison County Sheriff, and surrounding governmental emergency response agencies.

The following is a report covering the 2016 accomplishments for the Davison County Search & Rescue Unit/Emergency Management Department.

- Continued to complete dive training, developing a stand-alone dive team.
- Completed the revision of the 5 year Pre-Disaster Mitigation Plan, funded by the SDOEM.
- Posted Emergency Management events on social media via Twitter and Facebook.
- Coordinated the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC).
- Facilitated a 3 county Full Scale Exercise involving a vehicle/train accident.
- Managed the County AED life/batteries.
- Participated in the Safety Committee.
- Assisted in the 3rd Annual Home Fire Preparedness Project in Mitchell, which was a coordinated effort between the American Red Cross, Mitchell Fire Department, Davison County Emergency Management and Davison County Search and Rescue.
 - 25 volunteers installed 104 smoke detectors in Mitchell residences, which were provided by Red Cross. A total of 311 homes were attempted to contact.
 - o Planning is already underway for the 2017 Home Fire Preparedness Project.
- Assisted in the DOH Point of Distribution (POD).

- Briefed Mitchell, Mt. Vernon, and Ethan City Council, as well as the County Commissioners on the Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP) and other Emergency Management functions.
- Hosted a Severe Weather Spotter Training with 119 people in attendance.
- Monitored the Monthly Siren Tests in Mitchell, Mt. Vernon and Ethan.
- Assisted Regional Emergency Management in exercises.
- Attended the 2016 Emergency Management Conference.
- Continued to credential equipment with the Rapid Tag Printer, which will front load personnel and equipment arriving at a disaster.

In the past several years, the Davison County Search and Rescue has operated on a stand-alone yearly budget, relying on allocations from the City of Mitchell, and donations from the United Way. The remainder of the budget was from grants, one time donations from various local organizations; or covered by the Emergency Management Department. For Fiscal Year 2017, the City of Mitchell allocation and United Way donation was reduced. For Fiscal Year 2018, we request the same \$1,750 allocation from the City of Mitchell; which will be used toward the general operating expenses of the unit, to include the following:

- 1. The Davison County Search and Rescue Unit is frequently asked to support the Mitchell Police/Fire Department by providing security at local events, such as Corn Palace shows, Shrine Circus, traffic control, parades, rodeo, Bull Bash, etc. Unit members are used to reduce the overtime hours of officers. Funding is used to purchase Search and Rescue clothing/gear needed.
- 2. The Davison County Search and Rescue Dive Unit is a support arm of the Mitchell Police/Fire Department Dive Team. Dive Team training will continue to be offered to members, of which \$5,000 is budgeted for Dive Training in 2018.
- 3. The Davison County Search and Rescue Unit utilizes an eDispatch call out system in conjunction with the Mitchell Police/Fire Department. This system is used as an Emergency Notification System, which sends an emergency message to cell phones. Our share of the subscription is \$704 annually.
- 4. The Davison County Search and Rescue Unit has recently purchased a drone, which will be used to assist the Mitchell Police/Fire Department. Insurance is estimated at \$641 annually.
- 5. The Davison County Search and Rescue Unit is required to have a Financial Statement and Compilation Report completed annually, which will cost \$200.
- 6. All other operating costs, to include utilities, are covered in the Emergency Management budget on the following page.
