CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Reider called the regular meeting of the Davison County Board of Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. All members of the Board were present. Also present was Auditor Kiepke.

PLEDGE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairperson Reider.

APPROVE AGENDA

Motion by Claggett, second by Blaalid to approve the agenda for the January 16, 2024, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Nebelsick, second by Claggett to approve the minutes of the January 9, 2024, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

OPEN PUBLIC HEARING FOR 2nd READING TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE

At 9:15 a.m., motion by Nebelsick, second by Kiner to open public hearing for 2nd reading to amend the Davison County Ordinance. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Discussion was held regarding the amendment to the Davison County Zoning Ordinance.

P&Z Administrative Assistant Wegleitner stated that on October 3rd, 2023, the proposed amendment was denied by the Davison County Planning and Zoning Board. On October 23rd it was decided to continue setting the date of the 1st reading until October 31st. The 1st reading was then held December 27th, 2023.

A letter in support of the change to the ordinance was submitted by Michele Rumbolz & Scott Rumbolz.

Jeremy Jensen, owner of Jensen Capital & Development and Jensen Design Build who is the person wanting to develop the area was not present.

Mitch Peterson of Davenport, Evans law firm appeared on behalf of his client, Peggy Kelley. He reiterated what he stated regarding Section 13-05A1 of the Davison County Zoning Ordinance at the first hearing saying there are no special circumstances that exist and the land is already being reasonably used. He further stated the land was bought as ag land and can still continue to be used as ag land.

Commissioner Kiner stated that he had done quite a little research on spot zoning. He feels if this is approved by the Board, it will go to court and the County will lose.

Chairperson Reider stated that he believes this property does meet a lot of the criteria to be rezoned, which differs from Ms. Kelley's attorney's beliefs.

Commissioner Nebelsick stated that it is painful to watch good farm ground turned into housing, but also painful watching bad farm ground being forced to be utilized for farming.

Motion by Nebelsick, second by Claggett to approve the amendment to the Davison County Zoning Ordinance. A roll call vote was taken as follows. Nebelsick – aye, Claggett – nay, Kiner – nay, Blaalid – nay, Reider – aye. Motion failed.
