CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Reider called the regular meeting of the Davison County Board of Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. All members of the Board were present. Also present was Auditor Kiepke.

PLEDGE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairperson Reider.

APPROVE AGENDA AS AMENDED

Motion by Claggett, second by Blaalid to approve the agenda, as amended, for the January 30, 2024, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Claggett, second by Kiner to approve the minutes of the January 23, 2024, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT

Sonja Vanerdewyk, Mitchell Township, stated that Davison County is obligated to provide CVR's (cast vote records).

Auditor Kiepke replied that Davison County can't provide CVR records as SB 48, which would have provided for the release of CVR's, got sent to the 41st day. Therefore, according to the SOS, counties can't provide the record.

Steve Sibson spoke about capturing CO2 and the effects it will have.

She will become an employee of the State of South Dakota, effective as soon as the contract is signed. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

TAX SPLIT DISCUSSION

Kris Rake, Davison County Title Company and Darci Neugebauer, The Title Company, appeared before the Board to discuss tax splits and tax notices following sales of split parcels or portions of parcels.

Ms. Neugebauer presented several examples of tax/parcel splits she has worked with the past few months. She said that it used to be the seller's name would remain on the tax bill and the buyer's portion would be prorated until such time as the parcels were in the correct names. She reported that several buyers have received tax bills which don't reflect the parcel split. The buyer's name is placed on the whole parcel rather than on the split off portion of the parcel. Ms. Neugebauer also represented that tax bills for the entire parcel had been sent to both seller and buyer resulting in substantial confusion; she further represented that the County had not been appropriately helpful in explaining/identifying/remedying this.

Ms. Rake stated the companies have adjusted to changes over the years. She acknowledged that there had been discussions with the DOE regarding parcel splits in previous years. What she and Ms. Neugebauer represented has been occurring this year is different from previous practice. The above method is confusing buyers and sellers regarding the respective tax obligation of the buyer and seller.

DOE Weber presented a couple of examples of her own and talked about GIS and parcel identification requirements.

The commissioners advised DOE Weber to gather data from other counties to see how parcel splits are handled.
