APPROVE AGENDA

Motion by Claggett, second by Kiner to approve the agenda for the March 26, 2024, meeting. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Claggett, second by Kiner to approve the minutes of the March 19, 2024, meeting. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT

Sonja VanErdewyk appeared before the Board to ask for their support to repeal the current medical marijuana law.

Steve Sibson passed out a report regarding Chinese hackers.

He also talked about a dark software alleged to have been used to assess election equipment.

Sibson also said he understood discussing cybersecurity in executive session. However, he feels there is than a lack of transparency.

As per SDCL 1-25-2(6)(d) Executive or closed meetings may be held for the sole purpose of discussing information pertaining to Cyber security plans, computer, communications network schema, passwords, or user identification names.

Jim Borgstadt reported that he is carrying a petition in support of repealing marijuana, in part, because he believes THC levels found in marijuana can be as much as 40 - 90 %.
