July 15, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

Deputy Administrator Wegleitner called the regular meeting of the Davison County Drainage Board to order at 7:00 p.m. Auditor Wingert took roll call as follows: Members of the Board present were Larson, Buchholz, Bult, Klumb, and Nebelsick (called in). The members absent were Edinger and Kiner. Ex-Officio members present were Deputy Administrator Wegleitner. Ex-Officio members absent were Highway Superintendent Weinberg and Director of Equalization Vissia.

Guests: Mark Wipf, Gordon Stahl & Jim Stofferan.

OATH OF OFFICE

As this was the first Drainage Board meeting of the year, Auditor Wingert administered the oath of office to all the Drainage Board members present.

ELECT CHAIRPERSON

Auditor Wingert called for nominations for chairperson. Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Bult, to nominate Jay Larson as chairman. Auditor Wingert called for other nominations three times. Hearing none, motion by Klumb, seconded by Bult, to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Jay Larson. A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz-aye, Bult-aye, Edinger-absent, Larson-aye, Kiner-absent, Nebelsick (call in)-aye, Klumb-aye, motion carried.

ELECT VICE-CHAIRPERSON

Auditor Wingert called for nominations for a vice-chairperson. Motion by Bult, seconded by Klumb, to nominate Chet Edinger as vice-chairman. Auditor Wingert called for other nominations three times. Hearing none, motion by Larson, seconded by Klumb, to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Chet Edinger. A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz-aye, Bult-aye, Edinger-absent, Larson-aye, Kiner-absent, Nebelsick (call in)-aye, Klumb-aye, motion carried.

CHAIRMAN TAKES OVER MEETING

At this time (7:04 PM), Chairman Larson took over the remainder of the meeting.

MEETING EXPECTATIONS

Chairman Larson recited expectations of the meeting.

A checklist of items required in accordance with the Davison County Drainage Ordinance and SDCL 46A-10A will be considered on each permit. The checklist is on file in the Davison County Auditor's office and the Drainage Administrator's office.

APPROVE AGENDA

Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Bult, to approve the agenda for the July 15, 2025, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

DECLARE CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS

Chairman Larson asked for any conflicts of interest. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Bult, seconded by Klumb, to approve the minutes of the December 17, 2024, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT & CITIZEN COMPLAINTS

Chairman Larson asked for any public input for items not on the agenda and reminded all in attendance that no action would be taken. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

CONSIDER SHANNON HUTTERIAN BRETHERN, INC. DRAINAGE REQUEST

Motion by Klumb, seconded by Bult, based on findings, to grant a drainage permit to drain the following, as requested by Shannon Hutterian Brethren, Inc., SE ¼, less H-1, of Section 13, T 101 N, R 60 W of the 5th PM in the County of Davison (10000-10160-134-00).

The outlet will be in the NE ¼ of Section 19, T 101 N, R 59 W of the 5th PM in the County of Hanson (101-59-019-001-000-01).

The plan is to add 129,280.93' of 4", 6", 8", 10", 12" & 15" perforated & solid drain tile with one outlet in Hanson County, which goes into Twelve Mile Creek, a 3-dot blue line creek. The water will eventually merge with the James River.

Application received: June 20, 2025.

Applicant and necessary neighbors notified: July 1, 2025.

Published in the paper: July 5, 2025.

Deputy Administrator Wegleitner explained there were no calls or letters from abutting property owners or other residents. Shannon Colony obtained the necessary permits through the SD DOT, and the Hanson County Drainage Board has approved their application. Deputy Administrator Wegleitner explained that Mark Wipf from Shannon Colony spoke with some of the abutting neighbors about their project, and they had no issues.

Mark Wipf and Jim Stofferan from M & S Drainage, the contractor for Shannon Colony, explained that they would like to speed up the water when there is heavy rain, instead of sitting in the field. Jim Stofferan explained that he is working with the SD DOT and both Davison and Hanson County with their drainage applications.

Gordon Stahl, an abutting property owner, was present. The board asked if he had any issues with their application, and he had no issues.

Board members were given a few minutes to review the items to consider before a decision, in accordance with Section 2:05 of the Davison County Drainage Ordinance. The items were placed on the screen for all to view.

Special Conditions: None.

A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz-aye, Bult-aye, Edinger-absent, Larson-aye, Kiner-absent, Nebelsick (call in)-aye, Klumb-aye. Motion carried.

ADMINISTRATIVELY APPROVED APPLICATIONS

Deputy Administrator Wegleitner informed the board that there was one Administratively Approved Application for Roger & Richard Gerlach on January 22, 2025. The legal description of the project is the SW ¼ of Section 31, T 102 N, R 61 W of the 5th PM, Davison County, South Dakota. The drainage plan is to fill in about half an acre of the ditch in the field to make it farmable. The applicant plans to bring in dirt to make the land farmable around and near the ditch. There is a dam on the property the water flows into, then naturally flows into an unnamed stream, eventually ending up in Twelve Mile Creek, which is a 3-dot blue line. The applicant has no intention of filling in the whole ditch, changing the flow of water, or stopping the water, but routine maintenance is being performed. This is for information only, no vote required.

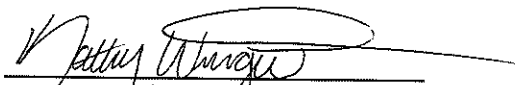

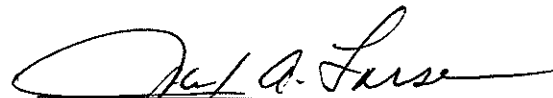

Ex-Officio members absent were Drainage Administrator Bathke, Highway Superintendent Weinberg, and Director of Equalization Vissia.

MEETING EXPECTATIONS

Chairman Larson recited the meeting's expectations.

Each permit will be considered based on a checklist of items required in accordance with the Davison County Drainage Ordinance and SDCL 46A-10A. The checklist is on file in the Davison County Auditor's office and the Drainage Administrator's office.

APPROVE AGENDA

Motion by Bult, seconded by Edinger to approve the agenda for the September 16, 2025, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

DECLARE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Chairman Larson asked about any conflicts of interest. None.

APPROVE AMENDED MINUTES

Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Bult to approve the amended minutes of the July 15, 2025, meeting. Consider Estabrook Ag Drainage Request was changed to Consider Shannon Hutterian Brethren, Inc. Drainage Request. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT & CITIZEN COMPLAINTS

Chairman Larson asked for any public input for items not on the agenda and reminded all in attendance that no action would be taken.

CONSIDER GORDON STAHL DRAINAGE REQUEST

Motion by Edinger, seconded by Klumb, based on findings, to grant a drainage permit to drain the following, the NE ¼ of Section 18, the NW ¼ of Section 17, & the S ½ of the SW ¼ of Section 8, all in T 102 N, R 60, in Davison County, South Dakota with the location of the outlet in the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of Section 17, T 102 N, R 60, in Davison County, South Dakota.

The plan is to install approximately 105,000' of drain tile in the S ½ of the SW ¼ of Section 8, the NW ¼ of Section 17, & the NE ¼ of Section 18, all in T 102 N, R 60, in Davison County, with the outlet in the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of Section 17, T 102 N, R 60, in Davison County. The water will drain into Enemy Creek, which will drain into the James River in Hanson County.

Application received: August 26, 2025.

Applicant and necessary neighbors notified: September 2, 2025.

Published in the paper: September 6, 2025.

Acting Administrator Wegleitner explained there were no calls from abutting property owners or other residents. Bryce Gillen from Gridline was present to answer questions. He explained the project consists of putting in new drain tiles along with cleaning out existing ditches which are shown on the drain tile map. The board asked if the outlet will be in the ditch and Bryce explained it will stay on the property owner's land. There are no issues with the NRCS.

Board members were given a few minutes to review the items to consider prior to a decision, in accordance with Section 2:05 of the Davison County Drainage Ordinance. The items were placed on the screen for all to view.

A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz-aye, Bult-aye, Edinger-aye, Larson-aye, Kiner-aye, Nebelsick-absent, Klumb-aye. Motion carried.

VLIEGER PROPERTY DRAINAGE DISCUSSION

Kiera Leddy, an attorney from Leut Services, presented some drainage issues addressed to her from concerned landowners, Scott Estabrook, John Fraser & Tom Bannwarth, on property owned by Steven Vlieger. The property of concern is legally described as the SW1/4 of Section 11, T 104 N, R 62 in Davison County, South Dakota. Mr. Vlieger's property has a county coordinated ditch running through it with culverts used as a place to cross from the NE side to the SW side, as there is no other way to access the SW side due to the ditch. Mr. Vlieger has been approached several times to clean out the ditch and fix the culverts, as the water is being blocked from flowing properly, and this causes the upstream landowners flooding, which floods out roads, crops and land. Mr. Bannwarth has also stated he would clean out the ditch using his own time and equipment, but Mr. Vlieger has refused any requests to help with the issues. According to a vested drainage right found, the last time the county cleaned out the ditch was before Mr. Vlieger owned the property in 1988, as he has owned the property since 1994. Pictures were presented to the board showing how the ditch in the SW1/4 of Section 11 was cleaned out and the ditch on Mr. Vlieger's property was unclean. Also, a video was presented to show how the water flows. Scott Estabrook presented information on the watershed and flood water path to the board. He explained water is overtop of roads 243rd, 245th, & 245th. This information is available in the Planning & Zoning Office. The landowners affected by the flooding caused by the uncleaned ditch would like the ditch cleaned and trees removed. Also, to remove the obstruction caused by the culverts, as law requires the drainage function of the ditch to be maintained.

Steve Vlieger explained when he purchased the land in 1994 there were 2 24" plastic pipes, and he purchased 2 36" culverts to replace the 24" pipes. He stated the ditch is functional, as you can walk down it. He said he had done some tree removal but never done dirt work. He explained that there are other blue lines and natural drainage ways that flow north is another source of the water issues. The board asked who could clean out the ditch, Acting Administrator Wegleitner explained county or the landowner can, but landowner must give county permission to be on the property. The board expressed

how the ditch is upholding water. Mr. Vlieger said he has no issues cleaning out the ditch, but he doesn't want his trees removed or mess with the slope. The board discussed the options of what culverts are needed to match the flow of the watershed and asked how wide the ditch is where Mr. Vlieger thought it was around 10'-12' wide. The board asked Mr. Vlieger how long it takes to drain, and it would take a week or two.

Acting Administrator Wegleitner reminded the board this was a discussion only and no action could be taken at this time.

ADMINISTRATIVELY APPROVED APPLICATIONS

Acting Administrator Wegleitner informed the board that there has been one administratively approved application from Gordon Stahl on August 28, 2025. The legal description of the project is the SE1/4 of Section 4, T 102 N, R 60 in Davison County, South Dakota. Gordon Stahl plans to clean out an existing county coordinated ditch, 11 which will help the ground out. The ditch is only on his property.

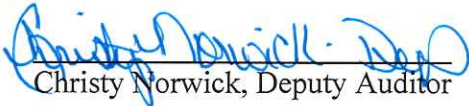

MEETING EXPECTATIONS

Chairman Larson recited the meeting's expectations.

Each permit will be considered based on a checklist of items required in accordance with the Davison County Drainage Ordinance and SDCL 46A-10A. The checklist is on file in the Davison County Auditor's office and the Drainage Administrator's office.

APPROVE AMENDED AGENDA

Motion by Edinger, seconded by Bult, to approve the amended agenda for the October 21, 2025, meeting. Steve Vlieger's administrative application was added. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

DECLARE CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Chairman Larson asked about any conflicts of interest. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Bult to approve the minutes of the September 16, 2025, meeting. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT & CITIZEN COMPLAINTS

Chairman Larson asked for any public input on items not on the agenda and reminded them that no action would be taken. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

CONSIDER MIKE DEINERT DRAINAGE REQUEST

Motion by Edinger, seconded by Nebelsick, based on findings, to grant a drainage permit to drain the following, the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 36, T 103 N, R 62, and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ in Sec. 36, T 103 N, R 62, as requested by Mike Deinert.

The plan is to install approximately 39,690' of solid and perforated 4", 6", and 12" tile in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 36-103-62, with a 12" solid outlet transferring the water to the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30-103-6. The water will outlet into the unnamed stream in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 30-103-61, travel NE under Interstate

90 into the NW ¼ of Section 29-103-61, then turn back NW, travel under HWY 16, and outlet into Dry Run Creek in the SE ¼ of Section 19-103-61. The water will then travel east through the City of Mitchell, into Firesteel Creek, then the James River, and then to the Missouri River.

Application received September 30, 2025.

Applicant and necessary neighbors notified on October 7, 2025.

Published in the paper on October 11, 2025.

Acting Administrator Wegleitner explained there were no calls from abutting property owners or other residents. The application presented is an extension and change of an already existing approved application from 2024, submitted by John Millan. Mike Deinert leases the land addressed in the drainage application. They are changing the 10" pipe approved in 2024 to a 12" pipe and adding more drain tile. The project will use the same drainage path.

The board asked if the landowners, Donna Havener and Jean Petsch, had been contacted. Acting Administrator Wegleitner explained that she sent out a letter of service.

Board members were given a few minutes to review the items to consider before a decision, in accordance with Section 2:05 of the Davison County Drainage Ordinance. The items were placed on the screen for all to view.

Special Conditions: None.

A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz –Aye, Bult –Aye, Edinger –Aye, Larson –Aye, Kiner - Absent, Nebelsick -Aye, Klumb –Aye. Motion carried.

ADMINISTRATIVELY APPROVED APPLICATION

Acting Administrator Wegleitner informed the board that there was one administratively approved application for Steven Vlieger on October 17, 2025. The legal description of the project is the NE ¼ of Section 14, T 104 N, R 62, Davison County. The plan is that the applicant will be cleaning out County Coordinated Ditch # 2. The applicant will also be removing the two culverts used for a passage to access the SW part of his property and replacing them with a bridge. The bridge will be made out of concrete bridge decking. There will be no more blockage in the ditch if the bridge plan works out. If the bridge design doesn't work out, Rusty Weinberg and Steve will figure out another design. This is for information only, no vote required.

The board raised concerns about who is financially responsible for the removal of culverts, installing the bridge, and cleaning out the ditch. Acting Administrator Wegleitner stated that it is between Steve Vlieger and Rusty Weinberg, and I will follow up with him.

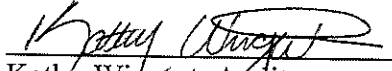

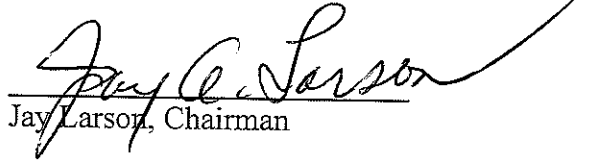

Chairman Larson called the regular meeting of the Davison County Drainage Board to order at 7:00 p.m. Deputy Auditor Norwick took roll call as follows: Members of the board present were Larson, Edinger by phone, Buchholz, Bult, and Klumb. Members absent were Kiner and Nebelsick. Ex-Officio members present were Acting Administrator Wegleitner. Ex-Officio members absent were Highway Superintendent Weinberg and Director of Equalization Vissia.

MEETING EXPECTATIONS

Chairman Larson recited expectations of the meeting.

Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Bult, to approve the agenda for the November 18, 2025, meeting. Roll call vote. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

Chairman Larson asked about any conflicts of interest. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

APPROVE MINUTES

Motion by Buchholz, seconded by Klumb, to approve the minutes of the October 21, 2025, meeting. Roll call vote. All members voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC INPUT & CITIZEN COMPLAINTS

Chairman Larson asked for any public input for items not on the agenda and reminded all in attendance that no action would be taken. Hearing none, the meeting moved forward.

CONSIDER TIM NEUGEBAUER DRAINAGE REQUEST

Motion by Edinger, seconded by Buchholz, based on findings, to grant a drainage permit to drain the following, as requested by Tim Neugebauer.

1. SW ¼ of Section 25, T 103 N, R 61 in Davison County, South Dakota.

The outlet will be in the SE ¼ of Section 25, T 103 N, R 61, except Lot A in Davison County, South Dakota.

The plan is to install approximately 1,494' of 15" flex dual wall perforated pipe in the SW ¼ of Section 25-103-61, with 2,047' of 15" flex dual wall non-perforated pipe transferring the water to the outlet in SE ¼ of Section 25-103-61. The outlet is 217' of open ditch to keep the water off Wilson's property and the road ditch. The water will outlet into the 3-dot blue line unnamed stream in the SE ¼ of Section 25-103-61, which will flow into Kibbee Ditch, then into Enemy Creek, and finally into the James River.

Application received: October 31, 2025.

Applicant and necessary neighbors notified: November 4, 2025.

Published in the paper: November 8, 2025.

Acting Administrator Wegleitner explained that there were calls from abutting property owners who expressed their opposition to the application. Acting Administrator Wegleitner stated that in 2023, Mr. Neugebauer presented a similar application, but it was denied by the board. Then, he was given an administrative approval application to replace an existing vested 12" drain tile, only on his property, starting west of the dugout on the SE ¼ of Section 26 and up to the old tile at the property line.

Tim Neugebauer explained that his previous application from 2023 was for a 12" line and went through Schuman's property. The present application will be for a 15" line and go north of the Schumans instead of through it. He is also asking for a 15" line instead of a 12", but is okay with the 12" if the board doesn't approve of the 15". Mr. Neugebauer explained that the only land to be drained will be his, as the tile going through the Wilson's property is non-perforated.

Teresa Wilson was present in person, and Paul Wilson by phone. The board asked if they would be okay with the application's approval contingent on a signed easement, and will the easement be perpetual. The Wilsons were okay with it, and yes, it will be perpetual.

Helen Geppert, downstream landowner, asked what the open ditch looked like. Derek Evans from Gridline explained the specifications, and an open ditch is necessary to keep the water off Wilson's property and out of the road ditch. Mrs. Geppert asked if grass would be planted or rocks placed? Mr. Neugebauer explained right away that there will be dirt, but plans will be whatever is requested to prevent erosion, like grass. Mrs. Geppert asked when the start date would be, and it was stated as soon as possible or whenever they figured out the easement. She expressed her concerns about how much water will be drained on her property and downstream, how much agricultural practices are being negatively affected, and sees a backup of water at the box culverts, as they can't handle the excess water as is. Mrs. Geppert asked why the red line doesn't go straight east? Mr. Evans explained the Wilsons had a preference for where it is placed for farming purposes.

The board asked if the easement would allow maintenance on the open ditch and who was responsible. Mr. Neugebauer stated yes, and he would be responsible. They asked if there was a difference between a 12" vs a 15" pipe. Mr. Evans explained that approximately 1,400 gallons per minute for a 15" and 12" would be 700 gallons per minute of water.

Ken Schuman, a downstream landowner, addressed his concerns about where the water will dump and the erosion it will cause. He stated there needs to be rocks placed or something to help. Mr. Evans explained that the outlet with the open ditch was designed to prevent erosion, and the pipe was not to sit on the ground.

Board members were given a few minutes to review the items to consider before a decision, in accordance with Section 2:05 of the Davison County Drainage Ordinance. The items were placed on the screen for all to view.

Special Conditions: The approval of the application is contingent on a signed easement between Paul Wilson, Barbara Wilson, Teresa Wilson, Joan Jerke, and Tim Neugebauer.

There was a motion by Edinger, seconded by Buchholz, to replace the existing clay tile with a 12" flex dual wall perforated on Lowell Titze's property and a 12" flex dual wall non-perforated on the Wilson's property, with the contingency of a signed agreement between Paul Wilson, Barbara Wilson, Teresa Wilson, Joan Jerke, and Tim Neugebauer.

A roll call vote was taken as follows. Buchholz –aye, Bult –nay, Edinger –aye, Larson –aye, Kiner –absent, Nebelsick - absent, Klumb –aye. Motion carried.

Motion by Edinger, seconded by Bult, based on findings, to grant a drainage permit to drain the following, as requested by Tim Neugebauer.

1. N $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, T 102 N, R 60, ex. S51 rods of W42 rods in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ in Davison County, South Dakota.
2. S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, T 102 N, R 60 in Davison County, South Dakota.
3. Lot 2 of Loudenburg Addition in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, T 102 N, R 60 in Davison County, South Dakota.
4. E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, T 102 N, R 60 in Davison County, South Dakota.

The outlet will be in the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29, T 102 N, R 60, ex. S51 rods of W 42 rods in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ in Davison County, South Dakota.

The plan is to install approximately 89,983' of perforated 4", 6", 8", 10" and 15" tile in multiple locations in Section 29-102-60, with the outlet in the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 29-102-60, ex. S51 rods of W42 rods in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$. The water will outlet into an intermittent stream, travel NE where it will flow into Enemy Creek, and eventually into the James River.

Application received: October 31, 2025.

Applicant and necessary neighbors notified: November 4, 2025.
